FBCA BUILDING AND GROUNDS AND CAPITAL PROJECTS COMMITTEE: REPORT FOR MARCH 17, 2013 FBCA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

PROJECTS COMPLETED IN 2012 AND EARLY 2013

- 1. FLORESCENT LIGHT FIXTURES IN MAIN HALL REPLACED: New fixtures give 20% more light and have low temperature ballasts so they come on even when the Hall is cold.
- 2. CEILING AND WALLS IN MAIN HALL PAINTED: Preceded by a large number of repairs and upgrades.
- 3. MAIN HALL FLOOR BUFFED AND TWO TOP COATS OF "TRAFFIC" from BONAR APPLIED: regular maintenance. Needs to be done every 4 to 5 years.
- 4. MAPPING AND LABELLING OF ALL ELECTRICAL PANELS AND OUTLETS: There are five electrical panels and innumerable outlets in the Hall so it took a long time. Thanks Robert Challand and Dave Edwards.
- 5. SEASONAL LAKE IN THE PARKING LOT: A lot better. Needs more material and work soon.
- 6. NEW FLOOR HOCKEY EQUIPMENT: To help protect refurbished floor. Sourcing and purchasing was organized by Eileen Tamemoto. Floor Hockey players are very grateful.
- 7. KITCHEN EQUIPMENT: Vivian Cruise did the purchasing to upgrade the kitchen equipment for caterers and large events.
- 8. THREE NEW CARTS FOR FOLDING TABLES STORED UNDER STAGE: Designed and built by Dave Edwards and Robert Challand. A grand improvement.
- 9. COMOX VALLEY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANT \$653.38 for furnishings: Two children's tables with adjustable legs have been purchased. Baby change table for WC addition to follow.
- 10. EMERGENCY PROPANE GENERATOR: Project complete. Many thanks to Dieter Broemer.
- 11. WiFi IN THE HALL: Hall users frequently request WiFi access. The modem is in the mail.

2013 CAPITAL PROJECT PROPOSAL - WASHROOMS ADDITION - APPROVED AT AGM

A 16' x 25' addition in the SE corner of the Hall, accessed from the Entrance Hall. through the Furnace Room, and the current location of the janitors sink.

Estimated Cost \$64,000 (before project specific donations of time and materials).

If we proceed with the project this year the Hall would be closed for a month in the summer of 2013.


RESOLVED AND APPROVED BY AGM: That the Board proceed with the "WC Addition Project", for a cost of up to \$64,000, provided an additional \$25,000 (at least) in Project funds are received before building begins.

We can expected a decision in late March on the FBCA application to the Federal New Horizons for Seniors Program for \$25,000 for washroom renovations.



STRESS CAN BE A BIG PAIN IN THE NECK.

In my Pilates classes, the single most common correction I give is the cue to relax the tension in the shoulders. Almost everybody gets tight in the upper shoulders; a rushed day, a cold wind, the weight of the world, if you watch the tv or your computer screen at the wrong angle, if you knit or weave or crochet, if you garden. Tension in the shoulders can lead to headaches, elbow pain, neck and back pain and general crankiness.

So just keep it in mind: where are my shoulders? Are they up around your ears? A lot of us respond to stress by gripping the muscles that run from the shoulder joint up into the neck. It's a big pain.



A simple neck reliever:

Sit at the front edge of a (kitchen) chair, feet hip width apart looking straight forward. Engage your low abdominal support, think of your spine as a long floating vertical seaweed and your head as a sphere floating at the top.

Little shoulders rolls: soft, push your shoulders in towards your neck, push up, roll back, in, up, back, do about 10, soft and slow.

Ok here comes the side bend

Always gentle and keep it small...

Cue your abdominal support, lengthen up the spine, spin the head sphere gently to one side, dropping your ear to your shoulder, a very small move, and gently stack the spine back up to vertical. Other side, lengthen the spine and spin the head sphere ear to shoulder, then roll the spine back up to vertical; each time another couple of vertebrae over into the side bend. Stay supportive through your abs, let your ribs move as well, they will transfer a little to the opposite side your head is bending to. Breath deep, in out, in out, etc.

These should warm up those muscles along the neck a bit.

With the onset of spring the coho fry are eating like teenagers and starting to smolt-up. Soon genetics and physiology will compel them to head to the ocean.

Our festival "The River Never Sleeps" is a perfect time for the smolt release in amongst the many other fun and educational activities. Make sure you add Sunday, May 5th to your calendar and join us at the Rosewall Hatchery for fish release, kelp tanks, bug, frog and snake tanks, fish painting, face painting, hatchery tours, a very 'family friendly' concession, and many more things for the family to see and do. Our festival started with three organizations, Fanny Bay, Nile Creek and Union Bay enhancement groups getting together to tell everyone who we are and what we do. This is our 6th Festival and every year there are new activities to inform and enjoy.

This past month we have planted close to 100 trees in the Cook Creek/Salmonberry Ponds area. We have also potted-up over 500 trees in the past few months.

Mid-April we will be installing the smolt trap in Mud Bay Creek to count the young coho leaving. April will also be busy as we start getting things in place for the major overhaul of the water system, tearing down a concrete raceway wall, installing four 10-ft tanks with associated plumbing. This is also the month that the chum and coho alevins emerge as fry and will be ponded.

The pinks at Wilfred Creek hatchery have hatched and are on their way out to the ocean. There is always something happening at the Rosewall Creek hatchery and we would love to give you a tour on any of our work party days Wednesday and Saturday from 9 am to 12 pm at the Rosewall Creek Hatchery on Berray Road.
