The Garden in December

December is the month to take a bow and congratulate yourself on a year completed in your garden. However, there are still some tasks that can be done. There is still time to divide and replant perennials if the weather is co-operative. Protect the crowns of tender plants in frosty weather. If you have stored begonia or dahlia tubers, or gladioli corms, check them to see none are infected. You can plant fruit trees and bushes in good weather, and mulch herb bushes if the weather turns very chilly. Rake leaves and debris off any lawn,

and avoid walking on frozen grass. If you have not already done so, clean your garden tools and have your mower and other power equipment serviced. This is a great time to do some garden planning for next year. Sit with the garden catalogues and imagine the bounty and beauty to come. FANNY BAY SALMONID ENHANCEMENT SOCIETY (FBSES) By Judy Ackinclose

Such an unusual fall again, no storms to put the streams in flood in fact at times we were concerned that we would have to do a fry salvage in October! What with low water in the creeks and such a great salmon run – both coho and chum - we were worried about the oxygen in the ever shrinking fish filled pools. Another issue was the predation by mink, birds, otters, bears and the 2 legged predators as well!!

With the low water it was certainly easy for our volunteers to scoop up a good number of chum from the Rosewall estuary. At present, we are holding 175,000 chum eggs. With one little pulse of rain, the water level in Rosewall Creek started to increase and in swam the coho right to the hatchery adult holding area. We have reduced the target eggs numbers for coho as Rosewall Creek is looking very healthy fish wise. This is an exercise we engage in each year to make an egg target decision according to the year's coho return.

The Wilfred Creek streamkeepers have picked up the Fanny Bay allotment of a million pink eggs from the Quinsam Hatchery in Campbell River and the eggs are now settled in their winter home at the Wilfred Hatchery. A team of volunteers takes water temperatures, checks that the flows are adequate and ensures the beavers don't become a problem.

This month we will conclude the egg take for 2013 and we will move on to clipping last year's fry. We are also looking forward to our Christmas Party in mid-December. Bring your Christmas guests down to show off our Fanny Bay hatchery. The hatchery hours of operation are Wednesdays and Saturdays 9 am to 12 pm, Rosewall Creek on Berray Road. SPID Report

The Ships Point Improvement District has begun Phase 1 of our necessary waterworks replacement and upgrade. This phase will take 18 weeks to complete. Please slow down and follow the directions of traffic control personnel while the construction is taking place. The majority of the work will be between the pump house and the junction at Tozer Road. Please be sure to check the mailbox notice boards for new information postings during the construction of this project.

In October the system pumped 955,000 imp. gallons of water.

2014 Budget process is complete. The annual water tolls and tax statements will be mailed in mid January 2014. Office hours will be expanded to take in payments by the March 1st due date. Cheques can be dropped through the office mail slot.

Concerts At The Hall?




