
In the hallway you can see the large cutout for the new entrance that connects the "old" hall to the new addition. The wide passage will enhance traffic flow.

# FANNY BAY SALMONID ENHANCEMENT SOCIETY (FBSES) By Judy Ackinclose June-July

The month of May started out to be warm and sunny and continued for our 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Festival "The River Never Sleeps". With such picture perfect weather we welcomed hundreds of interested visitors. Our greeters even reported 'drop ins' from such places as Switzerland and Germany! Everyone enjoyed themselves, ate dozens of oysters, met many volunteers from many organizations, put smolts into the creek and then all watched 25,000 more smolts leave (well, gently pushed) from the raceway to Rosewall Creek. Many thanks to Union Bay Credit Union, Island Timberlands, DFO, Quality Foods (Qualicum Beach), Mac's Oysters, Natural Glacial Water and Tomm's Market for helping us make such an impact on our visitors. We no sooner had finished with the festival and it was on to one of our big renovation projects at the hatchery. Jim Burgess has done an absolutely marvelous job of upgrading our major water pipes. These pipes were approximately 50 years old and looking pretty desperate. The upgrade is certainly needed. Brand new pipes and sparkling valves are aesthetically pleasing but more importantly there is peace of mind knowing that pipe failure is now a very long way off.

Phase two of our projects has started with the tearing down of one of a raceway wall and soon we will be placing  $4 \times 10^{\circ}$  tanks — more information to come next month! We now have ponded 70,000 coho fry from Rosewall and Wilfred creeks. They will remain 'in residence' until May next year. We just completed the monitoring and counting smolts at the Mud Bay Smolt Trap. Numbers this year are average.

Our Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held on May 9<sup>th</sup> and elections were as follows: President – Judy Ackinclose Vice President – Pam Lengyel Treasurer – Brenda Fisher Secretary – Lise Laguë Directors – Ross Radford, Finn Keim, Frank Lines, Rosemary Sparham, John Todd, Doug Mole and Bob Grant.

If you would like to help or just out for a coffee and meet our volunteers, our hatchery hours of operation are Wednesdays and Saturdays 9 am to 12 pm, Rosewall Creek on Berray Road. Come and have a look of our new piping, you will be impressed too!



# SPID REPORT

### Board position vacancy.

Due to other commitments, Brian McIntosh has stepped down and we thank him for his contribution to the board during his short term as trustee.

Have you ever considered becoming a member of our volunteer board? The Ships Point Improvement District currently has a trustee term open and elections will be announced in the near future as mandated by the provincial Improvement District manual.

If you would like to put your name forward, please contact our office for more information. The Trustees Handbook on the BC government website gives a great overview of what it takes to be a trustee.

**What's behind the scene of your community water system:** Power costs for supplying water have increased considerably. #3 well pump started May 6<sup>th</sup> due to high demand, consumption jumped to 811,000 gallons from 405,000 gallons the previous week. It then dropped to about 450,000 gallons a week due to wet weather. Please consider water needs carefully before opening the tap. You can help SPID keep water rates reasonable by thinking conservation of water and power costs.

**Fire prevention:** As the dry season approaches, please watch the sign at the entrance to the Ships Point service area for information on cancellation of fire permits and wildfire risk notices. A reminder that there are no beach fires allowed at the local regional park areas. If you hear the siren, shut off your water use to ensure the volunteer firefighters have adequate water flows to fight a fire in your neighbourhood. Volunteers for our auxiliary and firefighter services always welcome.

Our Summer regular Board meetings take place at 8am the second Wednesday of each month. Office hours are Tuesday and Thursdays 2 pm to 430 pm. Appointments can be arranged by calling the office at 250 335 0551 or emailing queries to <u>shipspt1@shaw.ca</u>
