


# **Author Reading Series Coming To Fanny Bay Hall**

### **Ships Point Improvement District Report**

#### **Board election**

At the public vote August 15 2013 at the Ships Point Fire Hall, Patricia Edwards was elected as the new trustee. Pat previously held a trustee position on the SPID board in 2010. Thank you to Jim Quinn for volunteering to serve as our Returning Officer.

#### What's behind the scene of your community water system

Please consider water needs carefully before opening the tap. You can help SPID keep water rates reasonable by thinking conservation of water and power costs.

In July our pumping metered over 5 **million** imperial gallons of water used by our system. Hydro costs were over \$3,000 for July alone.

THE WEEK OF SEPT 23<sup>rd</sup>, SPID will be digging a 4<sup>th</sup> well as part of the water system replacement project. There will be one day during this week where there will be NO WATER in the system for approximately 10 hrs. Residents should watch the mailbox bill boards for more detailed notice as we get closer to this turnoff date.

**Fire prevention:** As the dry season is here, please watch the sign at the entrance to the Ships Point service area for information on wildfire risk notices. A reminder that there are no beach fires allowed at the local regional park areas. If you hear the siren, shut off your water use to ensure the volunteer firefighters have adequate water flows to fight a fire in your neighbourhood. Volunteers for our auxiliary and firefighter services always welcome.



#### FANNY BAY SALMONID ENHANCEMENT SOCIETY (FBSES)

Where on earth has summer gone? Quick as a flash and it's over! One minute we are enjoying long hot days and then on to crickets, shorter days and cooler weather! As much as we all enjoyed the heat, it has dried up a few creeks engaging our volunteers at Rosewall, Cook, McNaughton, Hart, Hindoo and Emily creeks trying to save as many stranded salmon fry as we could. We now have a good number of fry in our care at the hatchery until the fall wet weather allows us to release the fish back into their natal stream. Great team work led by Ron!

Taking care of the growing fry at the hatchery is an ongoing every day occurrence, feeding, cleaning and flushing tanks, coffee and cookies — for the volunteers of course! Work is progressing on the major 10-foot tanks project. Phil and the team have been working on getting the pipes and setting them in at all the right angles. The four tanks were at Goldstream Creek and the problem was how to get them to Rosewall at a reasonable cost. The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure solved that problem as they had something else to be moved from Victoria and our tanks got a free ride! Less spent on trucks and more on the salmon!

We would like to thank the Baynes Sound Lions Club for their very generous donation to FBSES. All funding that comes to our society is put to good use whether it be for maintenance of the hatcheries, stock assessment, equipment to help volunteers with their work or "issues" that always pop up. THANK YOU BAYNES SOUND LIONS YOU MADE OUR DAY!!!
