Streams are drying up fast and our crews are out daily rescuing those poor fish that are stranded in small pools. Numbers at the hatchery are well over 23,000 from 5 creeks and more to come. 'Club Rosewall' is near capacity!

In the past month FBSES has been the recipient of some very generous gifts. Marc Vercllyn donated his professional time to clear 15 years of coffee grounds and etc. from our hatchery pipes! Bill Lane (WJL Enterprises) donated two countertops (from Colonial Countertops) and his time, as well as his son's, for installation. We also needed a new liner underneath some of our tanks and Island Waterscape gave us an excellent deal on the product. Amazing generosity in such a small community!

We now have seven newly trained streamkeepers who look forward to more time working in the creeks: Bessie, Roger, Jens, Pam, Sandra, Ron, Scot and Ray. CONGRATS!

With so many volunteers going on holidays with friends and families, work at the hatchery will be down to regular summer maintenance, feeding of the fish, net repairs and preparing for the fall run — yes we do have to think that far ahead. The pinks will be on our doorstep before we know it! We have also been working on our tree nursery getting ready for the many trees that will go out to other enhancement groups for planting this fall.

It is with great sadness that we recognize the passing of Ron Leversage, one of the founding members of FBSES. Ron played an integral part in the success of this organization. They were five dedicated people who started with a bath tub in a garage which has grown to a seventy-member group raising annually a hundred thousand coho, two hundred thousand chum and a million pinks. Quite a legacy!



The Garden in July

We can say that summer really starts in early July. Try and relax, and smell the flowers! Sit out in the evening's warmth, enjoy the night sky and smell the heady fragrance of lilies, night-scented stock, lavender, and herbs. This is a great time to enjoy nature's summer garden too. Hike through alpine meadows in our nearby mountains, and enjoy the beauty of hundreds of wildflowers. Walk through our coastal forests.

Our gardens are full of colour, fragrance and vitality. Annuals and summer flowering perennials are at their peak. Herbs and vegetables are ready for picking and eating. ENJOY!!!

Water containers and hanging baskets daily, but please be mindful about what a precious resource our water is. Regularly deadhead to encourage flowering. Support tall plants. Prune deciduous shrubs such as mock orange and weigela after flowering. Harvest vegetables and continue sowing lettuce, peas, kale, leeks and winter vegetables such as winter cauliflower and purple sprouting broccoli. Add garden waste to your compost, keep it moist and turn regularly.

SPID REPORT

Fire Danger Rating is HIGH. ALL FIRE PERMITS ARE RESCINDED.

There is a ban on open fires until further notice.

IF the fire siren sounds CONTINUOUSLY please reduce all household water use and turn off any watering appliances / sprinklers

It is estimated to be 1 to 2 weeks before the new 40 HP pump is received, installed and operational. The new pump and the entire system will be tested and commissioned when the new pump is installed. This activity may cause some cloudiness in the water that is short lived. The cloudiness is caused by a fine sediment that builds up on the walls of the water pipes over the year of low regular flows. The high volume tests release this sediment causing the water to be cloudy but harmless. In a short time the cloudiness is flushed from the system and your dwelling, it has no health consequences as we are still chlorinating as per VIHA regulations.

Conservation of water is important and we should strive as a community to reduce our consumption. To water effectively, water your plants and gardens during the cool evening hours. If you have a programmed water sprinkling system set it to come on in the early morning. Even numbered homes watering responsibly on even calendar days and odd numbered house watering on odd numbers days helps reduce equipment stress on our water system.

We will continue to keep you informed of our Capital Works construction activities through our monthly report in the Flyer, and the mailbox bulletin boards.

We advise residents to keep an adequate supply of drinking water on hand in preparation for water service emergencies. Call 250 335 2775 or 250 702 5724 or 250 335 0354 for water emergencies.

SPID office hours are Monday and Thursday 2pm to 4:30pm, pending business needs. Office appointments can be arranged by calling the office at (250) 335-0551. Messages are checked throughout the week. The Trustees meet the second Wednesday, July thru Sept at 8:00 am, at the SPID office on Vivian Way. All residents are most welcome, indeed encouraged, to attend.
