Terry Glavin is an author, journalist and teacher whose non-fiction has earned more than a dozen writing awards including the Hubert Evans Prize for Non-Fiction (2001), the British Columbia Lieutenant-Governor's Award for Literary Excellence (2009) and several national and regional magazine writing awards. He has published twelve books, the most recent in 2011, *Come from The Shadows: The Long and Lonely Struggle for Peace in Afghanistan*, Douglas and McIntyre. In 2006 came *The Sixth Extinction: Journeys Among the Lost and Left Behind* from St. Martin's Press. His books have been published in Canada, Germany, the United States and the United Kingdom.

Sarah de Leeuw, a creative writer and geographer, is a two-time recipient of a CBC Literary Award for creative non-fiction whose third book (*Geographies of a Lover*, NeWest Press 2013) was awarded the Dorothy Livesay Prize. Interested in social inequities and colonial history, her academic scholarship is published widely in research journals: her creative writing appears in many literary journals, including; *Filling Station*, *Prism International*, *Riddle Fence*, *The Malahat Review*, and *ARC*. She is an Associate professor with UNBC's Northern Medical Program, the Faculty of Medicine at UBC, where she teaches and researches Indigenous peoples' well-being and medical humanities.

FANNY BAY SALMONID ENHANCEMENT SOCIETY (FBSES)

Well we did ask for rain and snow, so obviously someone was listening to us, a snow pack to melt slowly in the spring/summer to cool down the creeks and rain to bring up the flows this winter in all the waterways. We are not completely off well water but at least we have started up a river water pump which helps slow down the alevins development. The idea is to mimic nature as much as possible and well water is just too warm.

Hooray!! Hooray!!! The 4 ten foot tanks are in and our team is just finishing up the last touches as to flows and water levels. They look fantastic and well worth the time and effort. These tanks are much better rearing containers than our aged leaking concrete raceways.

Wilfred pinks are doing well with just a minor issue at the hatchery from the freezing weather. Rosewall hatchery faired well also and this speaks to the pro-activeness of our wonderful volunteers.

Presently, we are ponding both coho and chum at the Rosewall hatchery and the pinks at Wilfred hatchery are swimming about in the incubators. It is a gratifying time watching the tiny salmon fry taking their first food.

The hatchery inside looks fresh with a coat of paint thanks to one of our wonderful volunteers, JP Cardinal — great job and just in time for our festival “The River Never Sleeps” on Sunday May 4th. Two other dates to keep in mind is our AGM May 8th and a streamkeepers course on June 7/8.

TRIVIA PURSUIT NIGHT!





March in the Garden

Ah, March, in like a lion, out like a lamb! The soil is warming up. Daffodils are out in all their golden glory, Easter lilies abound. Evergreen clematis (armandii) is blooming, as are Camellia, Daphne, Aubretia, some tulips, and flowering plum and cherry.

Watch for slugs and snails, they love those tender young shoots. March is clean up time. Effort you put in now will pay off all year long. Continue to clear and weed flower beds and mulch with compost. You can lift and divide perennials and plant new ones. You can begin to sow radish and broad beans. After the middle of the month begin successive sowings of peas, spinach, leaf lettuce and onion sets. This is the time to aerate your lawn, and apply dolomite lime. If you are fortunate enough to have nettles growing nearby, make a spring tonic of nettle tea, or nettle soup.
