# ANNY BAY SALMONID ENHANCEMENT SOCIETY

(FBSES) Wow, oh what a day it was!

Our 10<sup>th</sup> annual festival "The River Never Sleeps" was an out-standing day



with over 500 visitors, 29 FBSES volunteers and 57 people manning their booths. Weather was perfect, good entertainment, concession as usual was much appreciated, great comments by everyone. Definitely a day when families could attend, kids had so much to do, fish painting, face painting, bug education, releasing coho smolts and parents enjoyed talking to people in the many diverse booths.

Thanks to Erna Smith for producing our poster, Sandra Martindale for advertising, Brenda Fisher for concession and the many wonderful **FBSES volunteers** who really made this day possible; if it wasn't for them the festival would not have happened. Our major donors were Union Bay Credit Union, Island Timberlands, Thrifty Foods, Mac's Oysters, Scott Plastics and Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO). Winners of the prizes were Allister Clisham (Pacific Salmon Foundation print), Kieran Maxwell (gift basket) and Rosie Wood (gift bag). A perfect day, thank you to all! The cool rainy weather has kept the streams flowing but we know fry salvage could start anytime. This is a labourintensive job that is carried out by our volunteers, the final outcome is thousands of saved wild salmon that would have died in the steadily diminishing pools. Coho smolt counts smolts leaving the creeks and rivers for the ocean - have been carried out daily in the Relic Channel (Cook Creek), Wilfred side channel and Mud Bay Creek. The smolt numbers will be sent to DFO.

Again, great work by volunteers! Isn't this amazing! *YOU TOO* can play a part! Come and join our volunteer crew! Our hours of operation are 9 am to 12 pm Wed and Sat, at the Rosewall Creek FBSES hatchery on Berray Road. For more information, visit our website at **ww.fbses.ca**.







#### ATER SAFETY - when choosing a life jacket or PFD, consider the following:

- Check the label or stamp to confirm the flotation device is Canadianapproved. - Choose one that suits the type of boating activities you will be doing. Will you be wakeboarding? Operating a PWC? Fishing?

- Verify that the life jacket or PFD is appropriate for your size and weight (if a boater falls overboard when wearing a PFD that is too small, it may not support the weight of that person).
- Check that it fits snugly but allows for freedom of movement.

- If purchasing a life jacket or PFD for another person, ensure that it will fit - A label or stamp indicating that it is

that person.

Safe Boating Tip: If you are in a smaller, open boat (such as a small fishing boat), other boaters may find it difficult to see you. Choosing a brightly-coloured flotation device will help to make you more visible others.

Choosing a Life Jacket or PFD for a **Child** Many life jackets, although certified for use, may not properly protect a child. Choose a life jacket or PFD that has been specifically designed for use by children to ensure their safety.

#### A children's life jacket or PFD should have the following

- Canadian-approved
- An extra large collar to support the child's head
- A safety strap that fastens between the legs to prevent the jacket from slipping over the child's head
- A grab strap located on the collar - Reflective material & a safety whistle
- Children should be encouraged to wear a life jacket or PFD at all times both on the boat and when they are near the water.

# DUTTING ON A FLOTATION DEVICE IN THE WATER

Although we highly recommend that you wear a life jacket or PFD at all times while onboard your boat, here are our tips on how to put a flotation device on in the water.

Find a supervised area in which to practice the following procedure:

1. Spread the flotation device open with the inside facing up and out of the water and the neck facing towards you.

2.Extend your arms through the arm openings.

3.Lift your arms above your head, lie backwards and pull the flotation device around your upper body.

4.Fasten the zippers, straps, buckles and/or ties to ensure a snug fit.



JT THE BLOOMIN' BROOM! .. while it's energy is in its flowers in May and early June. Cut at ground level. Don't pull. Broom spreads rapidly and densely, choking out native species. A single plant can produce 18,000 seeds that last in the soil 30-50 years. It is a hazard and is toxic to animals and the soil. Broom will take over fields, pastures, meadows and farms, and can prevent reforestation. Broom seriously harms forestry, farming, tourism, our ecosystems and our health.

Use Long Handled Lopper. Cut broom at ground level. It will die in the summer's dry heat. If the broom is too big, cut off the manageable branches, including the low stems in the grass. Big broom dies easily. Pull out very young broom. If you and a group of neighbours, want to cut on highways info@broombusters first for contact MoT rules. Do Not Disturb The Soil as disturbance causes more seeds to germinate. Protect grasses and ground covers. Plant grass, native plants or trees.

Cut advancing edge and light infestations first. When you see a few plants alone, cut them first. Work towards the denser areas. Do not let new infestations get started or spread. At least cut off the flowers before seed pods form (June). To dispose of broom - on private land, take it to the dump, compost or burn. After seedpods form, be careful not to spread seeds. Pile in infested area to burn in fall or let compost. Along trails, push cut broom under shade of trees. In some towns, pickup or chipping may be possible but must be prearranged.
