

### **FBSES REPORT**

E ARE PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE that once again this year the Comox Valley Pacific Salmon Foundation Fundraising Dinner and Dance was a resounding success. Thanks to the many donations, willing participants and hardworking Committee members, headed by Judy Ackinclose, over \$40,000 will



be available to Comox Valley fish enhancement organizations in 2018.

Who among us doesn't pay attention to the weather? Especially when it is blowing 70 km/h and graces us with 60 mm of rain in 24 hours! The fish love it! This heralds in the chum and coho salmon to local creeks. Once again volunteers will be entering Rosewall and Wilfred Creeks to capture adult coho and chum for brood stock. Now you may have wondered what exactly does that mean and how is it accomplished? Well brood capture and egg take is an enhancement method, in part utilizing chest waders, nets, Zack knives, large aluminum basins, ice cream buckets and baking soda!! Now, we encourage all you curious folks to come to the hatchery for a visit to see how all these items play a part in brood take!

We are now up to 30,000 adipose fin clipped coho fry with 40,000 left to go. As well, the 30,000 salvaged coho fry (from Cook, Rosewall, Hart, McNaughton, Emily and Hindoo creeks) will shortly be returned to their natal streams.

Fall time is an excellent time for planting! And not just your garlic but for riparian



areas too! Four hundred trees have just left the tree nursery at the hatchery for Little River Enhancement Society and a coalition of volunteers in the Saanich area. We expect more orders shortly.

Our work parties are Wednesdays and Saturdays, 9 am to 12 pm, at Rosewall Creek hatchery on Berray Road. Come and pot up a tree, clip an adipose fin and find out what the heck baking soda has to do with fish eggs!!!! For more information, visit our website **www.fbses.ca**.



### ANNY BAY NATURALLY

We were enjoying the warm sunshine on the patio in early October when a strident "chip, chip, chip" jolted us out of our reverie. A small bird was perched on the peak of the roof. Although it was hard to make him out against the glare of the sun, his lightcoloured beak was a clue. "A junco?" I ventured. We looked in the bird book, and sure enough, he was a dark-eyed junco. The book mentioned that juncos usually appear in backyards in early autumn, and this one was right on cue, seemingly intent on calling his pals to the perfect winter retreat. "Chip, chip, chip," he went, on and on and on. His announcements must have worked, as there is now a resident flock of juncos in our yard.

Dark-eyed juncos are songbirds belonging to the sparrow family. A dark rounded head with a light pinkish bill distinguish the junco from other small birds. Dark-eyed juncos are brown or grev on their backs and breasts, with white bellies. Tails are dark in the centre and white on the edges. Females have slightly paler plumage than males.

You'll find juncos in fields, roadsides, parks, gardens, and edges of coniferous and mixed forests. Predation, habitat destruction, and collisions with manmade structures have had a negative impact on the survival of dark-eyed weeks, and are fully independent at juncos. Despite these challenges, they only three weeks of age. Dark-eyed junare one of the most numerous small cos usually live three to eleven years in birds in North America.

Flocks of 15 to 25 juncos are common during winter, with the territory of a sounds, with fast trills, whistles, warwinter flock covering 10 to 12 acres. Juncos warn other members of the group about potential danger by chirping loudly or showing their white tail feathers. When disturbed, the entire flock will suddenly fly up to a tree, chirping in aggravation at the intruder. Hawks, owls, squirrels, weasels, and cats are some of their enemies.



Mating season begins in April, with two to three broods a season. Juncos form monogamous pairs (mate for life). The male delivers sticks, leaves, and moss to the female, who builds a cupshaped nest on the ground, hidden under large plants, logs, or roots. Three to six light coloured, spotted eggs are laid, which hatch in just under two weeks. Babies leave the nest in another two

the wild.

Dark-eyed juncos make a variety of bles, tick sounds, and high-pitched chips all part of the repertoire. Juncos are known among birdsong experts as having an excellent "bird language" for study.

Juncos will be happy with whatever bird seed is in your feeder - they like black oil or hulled sunflower seeds, nyjer seed, cracked corn, millet, and oats, to name a few. Large hopper or platform feeders work well for juncos but the ground is where you'll usually find them. In fact, juncos spend about 65% of their time on the ground, skittishly hopping about, looking for food. Their diet consists of seeds and berries for the most part, supplemented with small insects during the summer.

My dad says that the birds at his feeder this autumn seem hungrier than usual. Perhaps our hot dry summer has not produced enough wild food for them or they know something we don't about the winter to come! If you haven't already, put up a bird feeder and keep it filled with bird seed. You'll be rewarded with visitors all winter long!



In addition to reducing air pollution in our community by turning yard waste into mulch, the SPVFA, a registered charitable organization, raised funds that will make a direct impact to our community. Donations are used to replace outdated equipment, and to provide training for firefighters, first responders, and emergency preparedness. A current goal for the SPVFA is to replace cumbersome gas generator-run lights with a mobile batteryoperated lighting system, which can save precious time during night-time emergencies and increase safety for firefighters when working in dark conditions.

No Charge for Lost/ Found items call 250-335-2698 **THE BEAUFORT WATERSHED** Committee is the new kid on the block for the Fanny Bay area and we would like to inspire you to support us in protecting your drinking water.

Why do we need a committee to protect our watershed? There are many regulations protecting the environment. Surely these are adequate to safeguard our drinking water? Sadly, there are cases nearby that should cause concern about the adequacy of the regulations, the monitoring being done and the enforcement of these regulations.

For example, in 2012, against overwhelming community opposition, the provincial government approved a permit to allow dumping of contaminated soil at a quarry above Shawnigan Lake. Within eight months of operation, VIHA had issued a "DO NOT USE" advisory for people downstream. Although further testing was done, and the water was ruled safe to drink, it tasted bad and caused staining. The dumping permit has since been revoked, but water quality remains a problem for the residents.

Closer to home creosoted timbers are being dumped in a quarry in Campbell River threaten-

ing local drinking water and fish habitat. Community members are fighting the dumping and other plans to dump further toxic wastes. Check out the explanatory video at <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?">www.youtube.com/watch?</a> v=YvZK5uEE bo

In both of these cases the community was required to react to a threat that had been poorly studied or inaccurately portrayed. By the time they had mobilized support damage was already being done. Our intent as a committee is to monitor threats to our drinking water **BEFORE** they occur.
