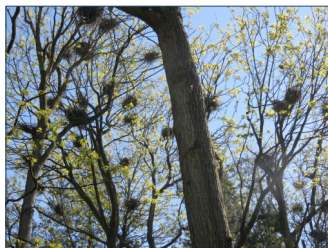

## FANNY BAY NATURALLY

When I was in Vancouver a year ago last spring to visit my daughter and her husband, they took me to see the heronry at Stanley Park. This amazing colony, close to 200 nests in any given year, is one of the largest urban heronries in North America. Although we don't have such impressive colonies in Fanny Bay, herons do nest singly in our area, or in small colonies. There are two residential lots on Ships Point Road that are home to heron nests and there are likely several more in Fanny Bay.



The herons in Fanny Bay are the coastal subspecies; the Latin name is *fannini*, which is oddly coincidental! There is no consensus on the origin of the name Fanny Bay; perhaps it was actually named for the great blue heron!

Great blue herons are exactly that - great and blue. The head to tail length is from 36 to 54 inches, with a wingspan of 66 to 79 inches, and a height of 45 to 54 inches. Adult males average 5.5 pounds in weight, while females are

almost a pound lighter. The blue colour is actually slate gray with a slight blue cast. Herons have some red-brown on their thighs and neck, and black and white stripes up the flanks and on the head. Immature birds are duller in colour.

Small fish are the meal of choice for herons, who locate their prey by sight, spear it, and swallow it whole. Herons have been known to eat shrimp, crabs, insects, rodents, amphibians, reptiles, and small birds as well. There's never a problem of too many cooks in the kitchen - herons are solitary feeders for the most part, although loose flocks do form occasionally. Most foraging is done while wading in shallow water, day or night, but herons will also drop from the air or a perch to catch a bite to eat. Herons are excellent flyers and can fly as fast as 30 mph.

In North America, great blue herons are generally migratory birds, however they are year-round residents in our region. Herons typically use the same nest every year, although they do choose new mates on an annual basis! Nesting usually takes place between February and April, with two to five pale blue eggs per nest. The eggs hatch in 30 days. Both male and female herons share "childcare" duties, from incubation of the eggs to feeding the young (by regurgitation), until they are able to fly and feed on their own at about two months of age. One brood is raised per pair per year but sadly, repeated human intrusion into nesting areas often leads to abandonment of the eggs or the chicks. Great blue herons can live to the age of 17 years or more.

The coastal subspecies of the great blue heron is listed as "Special Concern" in the Species At Risk Public Registry. All herons and their nests are protected year round, whether the nests are active or not, by the BC Wildlife Act, and during the nesting period by the federal Migratory Birds Convention Act (see the August *Flyer* for further information).

There are extensive guidelines for developing land near heron nests, such as buffer zones, and timing and noise considerations. Even cutting down trees *near* a nest and loud noises from



chain saws, chippers, and large trucks counts as disturbance, which is an offense under both Acts. Violations of either Act can result in sizable fines and/or imprisonment. If you wish to remove or modify heron nest trees, you MUST obtain a permit from FrontCounter BC and check with Environment Canada to see if a federal permit is required under the Migratory Birds Convention Act regulations.

## SPID BOARD TRUSTEE BY-ELECTION SATURDAY NOVEMBER 4th

Please consider standing for the SPID board. Without volunteers from our community, our cost-effective Ships Point Improvement District would not be able to function. Nomination forms are available at our office or [spid.ca](http://spid.ca). Nominations will be also accepted from the floor at the election to be held Saturday, November 4 at the SPID office, 7729 Vivian Way. Doors open at 9:30 am for voter registration. Election vote will be at 10:00 am.

One vacancy for Trustee needs to be filled, for the remaining portion of a three year term, ending at the AGM in April 2019.

- To qualify as a candidate one must be:
1. A Canadian Citizen
  2. 18 years of age or older and either an owner of land or spouse of an owner of land in Ships Point Improvement District
  3. A resident of the province for the previous six months as required in the Elections Act
  4. Entitled to be registered as a voter under the B.C. Elections Act

Anyone wishing to submit his or her name as Trustee candidate should do so by nomination form or letter to the Returning Officer c/o 7729 Vivian Way, Fanny Bay, BC V0R1W0 on or before the special meeting and election November 4.

## Smart Yard Waste Burning

We learned from the recent yard waste survey that many of our neighbours have had an issue with smoke from backyard burning. Some residents are seeking alternatives to burning, such as participating in the SPVFA chipping day event on September 30, while others have sought information on how to burn cleaner, to reduce the effects of backyard burning on their neighbours and themselves.

## Venting Index

One of the most critical factors for protecting air quality during yard waste burning is the province's Venting Index. The Venting Index forecasts local weather patterns that indicate whether airborne pollutants, such as smoke, will disperse or remain trapped at ground level.

BC restricts outdoor burning when the index is POOR (0-33) or FAIR (34-54). Local residents have been fined for burning yard waste during poor Vent Index days. Please check the Venting Index and burn yard waste only when the forecast is GOOD (55-100).

The vent index is updated daily at [spid.ca](http://spid.ca). It's also available at [www.env.gov.bc.ca/epd/bcairquality/readings/ventilation-index.html](http://www.env.gov.bc.ca/epd/bcairquality/readings/ventilation-index.html) or toll-free 1-888-281-2992.

## Burn Dry, Burn Smart

A wet, poorly assembled burn pile will produce a lot of unnecessary smoke. For more efficient burning, allow yard trimmings, downed branches, and weeds time to dry out under cover and out of the rain. A loose tarp allowing air flow underneath is usually sufficient. Material up to 5 cm (2") in diameter will take 30 days to dry properly; 5-15 cm (2-6") in diameter can take up to 2 months. When materials are dry, it is easier to start the fire with just a bit of kindling. A small, well-aerated starter pile will burn hotter and more efficiently. Once the fire is established, you can continue to feed the fire from your pile of dry materials. A fan or blower will provide airflow that can help keep the fire burning hot, minimizing smoke.

## FBSes REPORT

### ON AUGUST 20th, 47 FBSes VOLUNTEERS

and significants enjoyed an amazing potluck salmon barbecue. Everyone really outdid themselves creating wonderful dishes that were an epicurean delight! Fun and good times were had by all and we all learned a little more Canadian history with a Canada 150+ quiz!

The volunteers from both the Rosewall and Wilfred Creek hatcheries have been very busy in the past few weeks. The Wilfred Creek side channel team worked at cleaning out the main intake pond and preparing for pink salmon eggs. This involves organizing 21 volunteers for five days of egg takes at the Quinsam Hatchery in Campbell River, thus allowing us to receive a million eyed pink eggs later in the year. At the Rosewall hatchery volunteers have begun the ongoing adipose clipping of hatchery coho fry. A job that involves good eye sight, a steady hand and a willingness to listen to a few bad jokes. We have clipped about nine thousand with only 60,000 left to go! We have also completed a Rosewall Creek habitat survey with an eye to potential restoration work.

As an historical note of interest, Wilfred Creek was named after Wilfred E. Lawson, Geological Surveyor in 1922. We have always known this creek as Coal Creek and it wasn't until the new highway was built and "Wilfred Creek" signs were put up



that we had any idea it had changed names. Now you know!

The major Comox Valley fundraiser for the Pacific Salmon Foundation is on September 30 in Courtenay and is sold out. All funds generated from this event stay in the Comox Valley and importantly all local salmon enhancement organizations are eligible for grants.

There is still time to fin clip or join in a pink salmon egg take! Our work parties are Wednesdays and Saturdays, 9 am to 12 pm, at Rosewall Creek hatchery on Berray Road.

Never use accelerant like gasoline or lighter fluid as that can pollute groundwater which we all drink. Never burn non-yard waste or driftwood from the beach, which releases toxic smoke. Yard waste fires must be attended and safeguarded by an adult at all times until the fire is extinguished.

#### *The Trouble with Leaves*

Damp leaves will produce a large quantity of smoke, and dry leaves have a tendency to fly away, risking a fire spreading out of control. Many municipalities prohibit the burning of deciduous leaves altogether for these reasons.

Fortunately, leaves are the easiest material to compost, requiring very little effort to achieve "black gold" for the garden. Composting leaves is no more work than building and tending a fire, but goes a long way to reduce smoke in our neighbourhood. You can leave areas under trees and shrubs to collect leaves with no harm; in fact they will appreciate the return of nutrients the leaves bring as they break down. If preferred, you can reduce the volume by running over leaves with a lawn mower before spreading. Alternatively, inexpensive wire fencing material can be purchased by the foot, which makes an excellent, compact bin for collecting leaves, hidden behind a shed or garage. Simplest of all is loading leaves into garbage bags punched with holes to allow airflow, set in a secluded corner. In about 12 months you'll have an excellent, moisture retentive mulch for the garden, which will help plants, shrubs and trees get through our dry summers.
