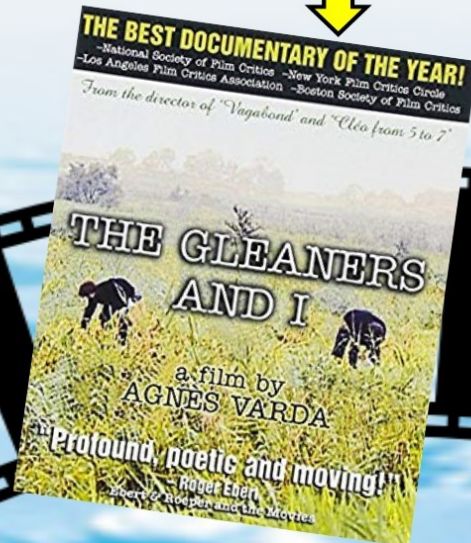

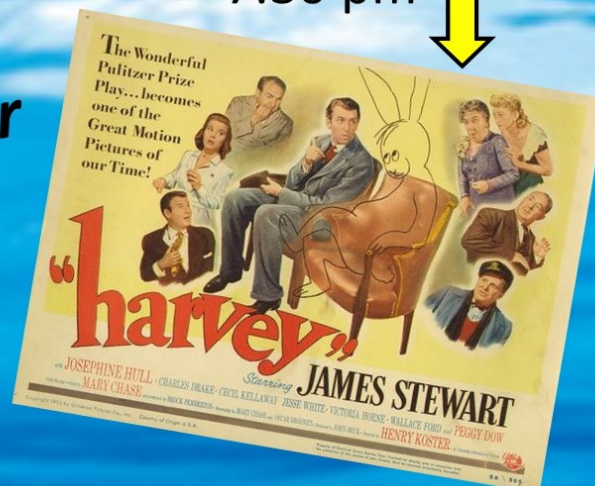

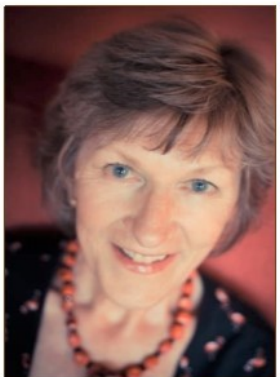


ECKO ALECK was born into the Nlaka'pamux Nation and adopted into the shíshálh Nation. Her traditional name Kawaya, or Blue Jay, represents laughter. She is a spoken word artist with a vision to be a voice for her people. She is trained in both Interior Salish and Coast Salish protocols. Since the age of 13 she has travelled with her father, Terry Aleck, to discuss the intergenerational traumas of residential schools as well as perform and teach Indigenous songs and dances to elementary and secondary students. Ecco Aleck has been recently selected to go to the Indigenous Women's Leadership Summit in Ottawa. Congratulations!

Ecco Aleck says, "I aspire to combine my love for First Nations culture with audio and visual media arts and focus my performances on current issues that affect Aboriginal people. Art in any creative form is an essential part of my life."



With *Insomnia Bird*, **KELLY SHEPARD** establishes himself as Edmonton's chief bricoleur, honouring and copying the bird of the title, the magpie Edmontonians know so well, with its huge nests built out of the detritus it finds everywhere in the city. As his epigraph to the whole book (stolen in magpie fashion) puts it: 'And of these one and all, I weave the song of myself. / – Magpie, on nest-building.' *Insomnia Bird* builds its own nest of observations, insights, memories bad & good, & old-fashioned boosterism turned awry. Shepherd...is a keen observer. What he sees, and catches widdershins in these pieces is a whole that is both more & less than most of us acknowledge or comprehend. And it's also what his magpie oversees, so to speak, as well as helps to construct. Shepherd's reach is wide; he seeks & finds material for his textual magpie nest across this ever-expanding cityscape. Amanda Hale has published three novels, a book of stories, two chapbooks, and two collections of linked fictions. A fourth novel, *Madhatter*, is forthcoming in Fall 2019.

Angela of the Stones is a book of linked stories set in Baracoa, Cuba. We come to know the inhabitants through their dreams and frustrations, their daily challenges, and the manner in which they stay afloat in a sea of constant change.

Ángela sleeps rough in Parque Central, dreaming her life into order; Godofredo, the peanut vendor, limps the streets; Gertrudis ponders the testimony she must give on yet another anniversary of the 1953 assault on the Moncada barracks; Aurelia idolizes an Italian priest who is banished from Cuba in disgrace; Daniela flies from her roof in a moment of divine spontaneity; Clara struggles with bureaucratic forces; Berto sacrifices a kidney for the sake of love; Evangelia comes home triumphant from her medical mission in Venezuela; the imaginary childhood world of Hipólito Hernando Aragón del Portillo shapes the vaulting ambition that ultimately destroys him; Tito, a Miami-Cuban expat, is infuriated by the prospect of a Cuba-US accord; Sonia watches in wonder and confusion as her daughters grow up into another world where peer approval and technology rule.

REGISTER NOW FOR SPRING FIRST AID COURSE

The Association would like to offer a first aid course at the Hall. Based on response the one day class could be scheduled for March 2019.



The Red Cross Emergency First Aid covers babies, children and adults for basic life support with bleeding control. It has a 3 year certification; a book emailed to the student; cost **\$95.00**. A recertification class is half a day/4 hours.

The WorkSafe Level 1 covers adults for basic life support as well as bleeding control, and plenty of medical emergencies such as minor wounds. It also comes with a 3 year certification and a book; cost is **\$85.00**.

VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS SHIPS POINT NEEDS YOU

Community service, ongoing training, federal and provincial tax credits

Ships Point Volunteer Fire Department is actively recruiting new members. We are looking for men and women of all ages to join our department. No previous firefighting experience is necessary: training is ongoing, interesting and at times challenging.

Did you know that volunteers make up more than 80% of B.C.'s firefighters? As a volunteer organization, we recognize that many of our volunteers have work, family commitments, and holidays that are important. Some of our firefighters are retired and some still work so we stagger our practices; two a month in the evening and two a month in the morning so that no matter what your schedule you can participate. We have a mutual aid agreement with Fanny Bay Volunteer Fire Department to provide assistance for all structural fires.

A federal non-refundable tax credit of \$3,000 has been joined by a provincial tax credit of \$3,000 for those who attend enough practices and training courses. A tax credit is a reminder that the government views our efforts as being of value; but of course this is not the reason that anyone volunteers to become a firefighter. Among the men and women that make up SPVFD you will find one common thread; the desire to be of service to our community.

To serve the community effectively we train throughout the year using in-house resources and those of other mutual aid fire departments: Fanny Bay, Comox, Courtenay and Oyster River. Our goal: to be a department that is "Professionally staffed by Volunteers." Fire Chief Terry Hoffart comes from a military background and offers powerful organizational skills and a clear view of the importance of training, taking some of our members up to Firefighter 2 level. Many of the Firefighters have chosen to train as First Responders, providing a vital service between the 911 call and the arrival of the ambulance. Air brake certification training is provided for those who wish to drive the fire truck.

Community education is important as well, and we host an annual Fire Safety Week event in October in conjunction with the FB Fire Department. Close Before You Doze reminds us that shutting bedroom doors before sleep saves lives; Two Exits reminds us to ensure we have two ways out planned in case of fire. The flammability of modern fabrics and foam in our furniture makes it more important than ever to plan ahead for a speedy exit in case of fire. Firefighters take part in an annual walkabout to remind people to check their smoke alarms and raise awareness of fire prevention.

SPVFD is comprised of men and women of all ages, some working, some retired, who have energy, commitment and enthusiasm. Being a firefighter is challenging, but rewarding as well. There is a sense of camaraderie developed through working together and pushing ourselves to become better, one practice at a time. No previous experience is necessary: come on out, fill out an application form, meet the chief and see if becoming part of this vibrant community of volunteers is for you. Interested?

FANNY BAY NATURALLY

Here are a few tips for feeding wild birds in your yard this winter.

Bird safety - Keep feeders away from windows and apply decals to the glass to prevent collisions. Clean feeders frequently to prevent mold, which can be deadly to birds.

Diverse diets - Some bird species feed low, others high, and the rest somewhere in between, so locate feeders at different levels to attract a wide variety. Working on the same principle, offer different seed blends in different feeders. Some birds, like robins, do not eat seed; soak some raisins or currants in water overnight and put them out on a table style feeder. Provide suet only in cold weather to avoid rancidity. In warmer weather, a good substitute is five parts cornmeal mixed with one part peanut butter, stuffed into holes drilled into a hanging log or in the crevices of a large pine cone. And don't forget the Anna's hummingbirds that live here year-round (see column in the June Flyer).

If you cherish wild birds and wild lands, change up your holiday gift-giving by making a donation or giving a membership to one of the many nature-related groups in the Comox Valley. A list can be found at <https://tidechange.ca/info-sections/community-groups/> with links to wildlife rescue societies, conservation groups, nature clubs, and more. Author Edward Abbey said, "Wilderness is not a luxury but a necessity of the human spirit."

NEW NEIGHBOURS CAN MAKE A BIG DIFFERENCE
 In our enjoyment of the place where we live. This month I'd like to introduce you to some of them who are making a big difference for the salmon that are the heart and soul of what we do at the Fanny Bay Salmonid Enhancement Society, as well as on your street and neighborhood.

Randy Lousier of Vivian Way describes himself as semi-retired, but as a licensed electrician with 40 years experience is also still busy. He's one of the many Fanny Bay Salmon volunteers who find the satisfaction of



Janet Haigh and Doug Barnes, who now live on Bates, are one couple of several in the society who both find salmon enhancement a good place to contribute their efforts and gain satisfaction from them.

For Janet, who developed software patterns for knitters, the appeal of salmon enhancement at Fanny Bay is its science-based and outdoor-oriented atmosphere that allows independent work within a great sense of community.

Doug says he's a member of FBSES because "it's an opportunity to give back" to the place he's lived all his life. He was born in Courtenay, owned his own home inspection business in Victoria for 20 years and is now "retired full time" in Fanny Bay. Doug is impressed by the amount of work society members do to produce the salmon raised every year by the hatchery.
