Fanny Bay Community Association is pleased to announce that it is the successful recipient of a 2019 New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP) grant. This grant will be used to develop the new **Fanny Bay Canine Companionship Park**, a project that will result in the creation of an off-leash dog park, as well as the *Adopt a Dog Buddy Program* – an initiative that will see dog owners make their dogs available for visits with seniors who cannot own a dog for one reason or another but truly love their companionship.

The NHSP provides financial support for projects that encourage seniors to engage in their community, and increase their social participation and inclusion. This is the key to improving their well-being and quality of life, as well as enabling them to stay active and share their knowledge, skills and experience with members of the community.

The next step in the project's process is to assemble a *Project Steering Committee* of 10-12 people to work with the project coordinators. The role of the Steering Committee will be to:

- Learn about various aspects of the project
- Guide the planning process; provide input to the project coordinators working on the project that can be considered in developing the vision, policies and goals for Fanny Bay Canine Companionship Park that reflect the community's needs and wants
- Spread the word about this project and encourage others to participate
- Support public engagement activities

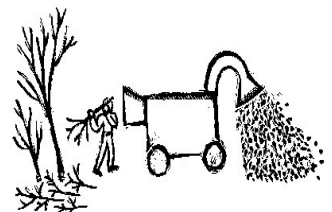
## SHIPS POINT CHIPPING DAY Saturday, April 6TH

Ships Point Volunteer Fire Fighters

Association will hold a Chipping Day for Ships Point residents on **Saturday, April 6, 2019**. Yard waste will be chipped at the roadside if it fits the following criteria:

- clean brush only, branches 1/2" to 4" in diameter, no smaller or larger, foliage does not need to be removed
- no raked material, to avoid stones injuring the crew or damaging the machinery (raked material can be composted)
- no blackberry stalks
- stack material parallel to the street, butt ends facing the same direction.

Chips can be kept by the resident or will be hauled away.

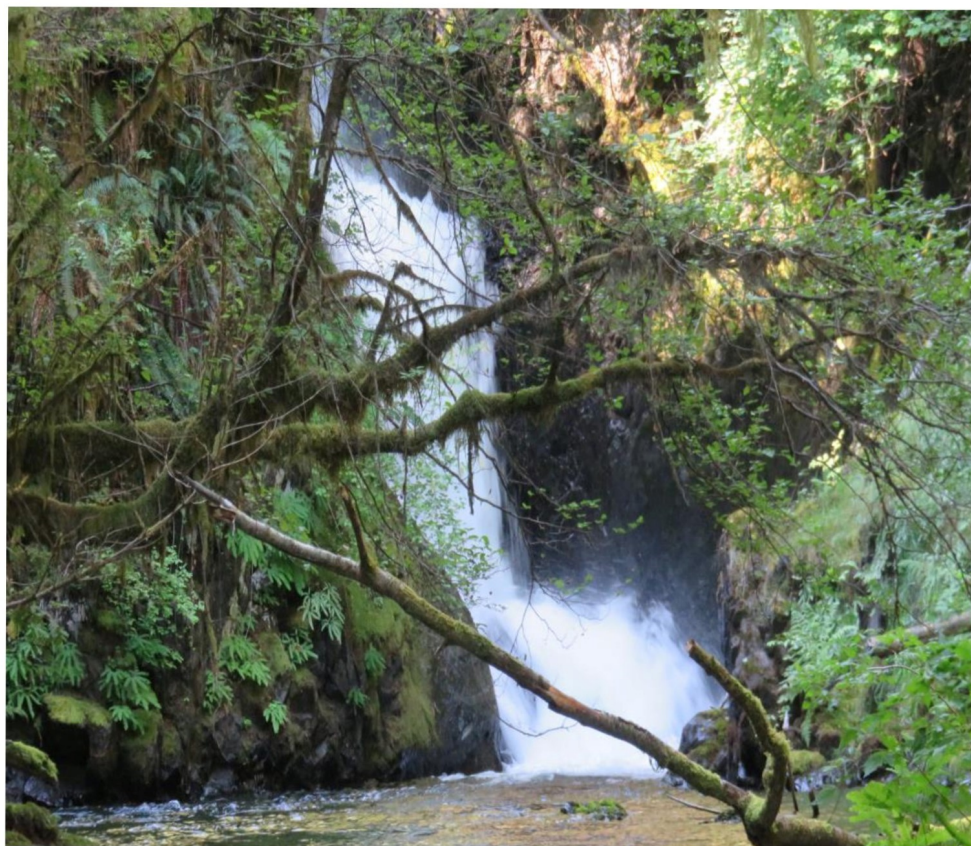

## FANNY BAY NATURALLY

With all the snow we had in February, many of us are desperately casting about for signs of spring. An old wives' tale declares the robin as the first sign of spring, but in truth, our American robins are adaptable birds, and while many of them make their winter home as far south as Baja California (as some of us, in retrospect, wish we had done), there are many hardy souls, robins and humans alike, who remain here year round. But where are these hardy robins? Well, just like us, they are hunkered down, waiting for milder weather to return, but instead of sitting by a cozy fireplace, the robins are roosting in the trees.

The name 'robin' is derived from the Latin word *ruber*, meaning red. In the fifteenth century, when human names were often given to familiar species, this bird came to be known as robin redbreast, which was eventually shortened to just 'robin.'

Robins are so well known that a description is hardly necessary. A member of the thrush family, an American robin measures from nine to eleven inches long, and is greyish-brown in colour, darkening to black on the head and tail. The throat is streaked in black and white, and the breast, as we all know, is orange-red. Males and females are similarly coloured, with the female being somewhat duller overall.

The robin's song is a welcome herald of spring to the winter-weary. The melody of short rising and falling phrases is most often sung in the early morning and late evening. Coming upon the discarded half-shells of those lovely blue-green robin eggs as the season advances, confirms that spring has indeed arrived. A robin lays four or five eggs in a nest of twigs, grasses, and mud, built in the crotch of a tree or other



suitable location. Incubation lasts 17 days and, after hatching, the young birds grow rapidly. Although two or three broods may be raised each season under favourable conditions, only 40 percent of nests are successful on average, and only a quarter of those fledglings survive through autumn. A robin can live for many years, with the oldest recorded American robin living to one month shy of its 14th birthday but, in nature, only about half of the robins alive in any given year will live to see the next.

'The early bird catches the worm' is a proverb that the robin takes to heart. Robins eat a wide variety of fruit and insects depending on the time of day, but earthworms are the breakfast favourite. Because of this, it is wise to keep the 'breakfast table' - lawns and gardens - free of chemical pesticides and fertilizers. Not only are chemicals harmful and even lethal to robins, they also kill the worms and other insects that make up part of the robin's diet. Later in the day, robins prefer fruit, and berries are a favourite. My mountain ash tree was so heavily laden with berries last autumn that I feared the branches would break. A small flock of robins came to the rescue, making short work of the berries in just one afternoon! Robins can be enticed to a platform style feeder if it is stocked with fruit such as halved oranges, chopped apples, and berries. Although they don't care for birdseed, they might be tempted by hulled sunflower seeds or shelled peanuts, and they also enjoy suet and mealworms.

I saw a few robins in my garden in January but I haven't seen any since the snow descended upon us. Hopefully, when I next see those red, red robins bob, bob, bobbin' along in my yard, the snowstorms of 2019 will be well behind us!

**LOTS OF TODAY'S IMPRESSIVE THINGS** started out small or insignificant. Such is the history of Fanny Bay Salmonid Enhancements' charming little Wilfred Creek Hatchery. Wilfred Creek, to start from the beginning, is often better known as Coal Creek around here, but has been officially

Wilfred since 1923 when it was named after Wilfred E Lawson of the Geological Survey of Canada. In 1989 the DFO dug a water supply channel near the creek, built a pond as a reservoir, four more for rearing areas, and a small square "upwelling" incubation box, only eight feet to a side and about knee height, to hold trays of pink salmon eggs in a constant flow of stream water until they hatched and swam out. All of this was done by accident, because the land along the creek was owned by the Weyerhaeuser Company, who granted a licence to allow the whole thing to continue, as it has to this day. This star-crossed beginning, to steal a phrase, has led to the Wilfred Creek Hatchery that is the smaller one of the pair Fanny Bay Salmonid Enhancement Society operates.

In the 30 years since, a small box that could hold a million pink eggs is now a building holding incubation trays and tanks for not only pinks but also chum and coho salmon. Around it is a storage container box, some outdoor fish raising troughs and an old-fashioned toilet, because the only running water is what hatches those salmon eggs, and there is no power. Wilfred Creek is also the site of years and years of enhancement projects; more

ponds and side channels, improvements, bank tions, tree plantings, gravel and a variety of other things better for growing salmon. There is a lot of bureaucratic background to every environmental project, but we will save our fascination with it for another day.

Much of FBSES' early efforts were spent at Wilfred, even before there was an FBSES. The difficulties of organizing, fund-



raising, and dealing with government led to the realization that we needed some bureaucracy of our own and the society was incorporated in 1995. By then there was a simple frame building over an improved upwelling box, on poured footings and some improvements to the habitat and water flow.

Fast forward to our Wilfred Creek Boys. They were boys once but that's their crew name now, and they are all from Tozer Road in Fanny Bay. Keith Thibault is the crew's leader and the whole gang consists of Keith, Larry McDonald, Rudi Spatzl, Helmuth Geiger and Bill French, with Frank Lines providing sage advice from his years of responsibility for Wilfred. They meet to do the endless maintenance every hatchery needs, as well as checking water quality, temperature and flow, fish health and wellbeing, and growth. In season there's fry salvage, brood capture of both Wilfred chum and coho, clipping and releases.

The numbers change from year to year. Fewer pinks and more chum and coho will be produced in future, because they are more successful in returning to spawn on their own. In the meantime, the work goes on, toward the great day when this year's broods follow their predecessors and parents out of the hatchery, into the creek and down Wilfred to the sea.

In last month's Flyer our picture of the FBI presentation, two names listed were wrong. Roxanne Milligan presented the cheque and John Milligan was at the left of the back row in the photo. Wrong names were the fault of the writer, not the Flyer.

# DANIEL ARBOUR - AREA A UPDATE - WINTER 2019

Dear Fanny Bay residents,

Over the coming four years I will endeavor to write short quarterly updates in this paper, relaying CVRD news and information that are relevant to each community in Area A.

After three months in office, I am happy to report that things are going well. The CVRD has professional staff and our board members work well together. So far when we disagree we do so in constructive ways and everyone seems to be there for genuine public service reasons.

In December, we went through our orientation and a strategic planning session, which amongst a handful of priorities identified the core theme of "sustainability" as a core regional focus. Then in January and February it was budget time. We have 99 services and budgets across the CVRD, each with its own considerations both short and long term. In Area A, we have the most services than any of the CVRD jurisdictions at 72! Each community in Area A has distinct and unique relationships with the CVRD. For example, Hornby Island has

almost twice the level of services (and therefore tax requisition) when compared to Fanny Bay. There are many reasons for this, and I look forward to sit down with communities to discuss their services, and how your tax dollars are put to work. Maybe we can look to host "bring your property tax bill" sessions? Let me know if you are interested. I truly believe that educated and transparent discussions about our taxes is a great way to build our communities and shape them the way we want.

Externally, I am also honoured to have been appointed as the CVRD external representative to two organizations: The Vancouver Island Library board, and the Island Corridor Foundation, which owns the train track from Courtenay to Victoria. The Vancouver Island Library Board we all pay some taxes towards, and the Island Corridor Foundation we jointly own with four other regional districts and five First Nation communities. For the latter one there is no yearly tax requisition, but a lot of debate!

I could go on and on, but I think I will stop here.
