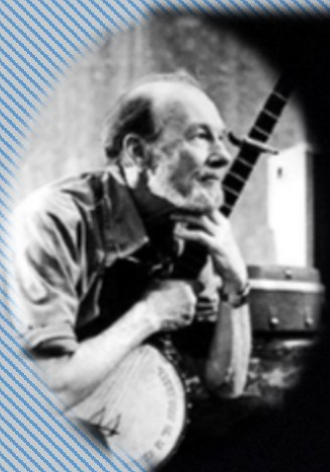

Owners of un-licensed dogs may also be subject to fines, however, the CVRD is always looking for compliance with our bylaws.

WHAT WOULD YOU SAY IF I TOLD YOU

large groups of your neighbors have been dressing in form-fitting rubber clothing, meeting in groups in strange places, and engaging in strange rituals that result in some innocent creatures being gathered up and held against their will? You'd say, "Dave its brood capture time at Fanny Bay Salmonid Enhancement Society and that's what you people do." Yes, indeed. We put on waders and life jackets and dry suits and gumboots and meet at the sides of local waterways like Rosewall Creek and Wilfred 'Coal' Creek and carry seine nets out into the streams to try to surround Chum and Coho spawners so we can bring them back to the hatchery to raise their eggs to be released into those same streams as fry and smolts that will, in a few years , return to those same spots to spawn. It is a long and involved process, much like that last sentence.



Now, this looks like it should work. But the Coho have other ideas, so brood capture is not automatic.

By the end of November the Chum salmon run has come and gone, but the Coho are still picking and choosing when they will arrive and where. FBSES hatchery fish know their way; we find them coming up our fish ladder to the brood channel as soon as we fill it. For their wild compatriots, we

have to do all the fancy dressing and strange manoeuvres like setting blocking nets above and below their holding pools, then trying to walk another net through deeper than comfortable water to encircle some of nature's fastest swimmers before they shoot between your feet like large grey bullets and hide somewhere else. It is a puzzling mixture of success and failure for those trying it. Puzzling because we're smart and we have a system to catch them that should be working, but it often doesn't. And because Chum salmon come back on a tight schedule - they have about nine days to complete their life cycle by spawning in their home creek - we have to be organized to get our nets full of fish who haven't finished the dating game. With Coho, who we know can spend months in Rosewall waiting for the perfect combination of Mr. Right, the right spot and water quality, and the right time and place, we have to get lucky before they do.

Lots of hatchery fish are in Rosewall this year and will spawn the next generation of wild fish themselves, thank you very much, and we at FBSES, who have been cutting back our production as the runs grow over the years, are happy for them. We continue our streamside gatherings in (mostly) waterproof clothing, chest-deep excursions across unseen boulders in flowing water - the trick is keep your feet out of the net and the fish in it - then the heavy labour of carrying fish in water filled tubes to our oxygen equipped transport trailer from below a steep bank. It has to go on because this success was created, it didn't just happen.

This year's brood capture season has also been a good time because we have a lot of new faces wearing those interesting outfits. Joining FBSES recently are Bruce Pozer, Dave and Bev Racicot, Jeremy Maude, Barry and Lesley Seeley, and Bruce Ackinclose, (brother in law of Judy). They were more than welcome and so are you every Wednesday or Saturday morning at the 2825 Berray Road location of FBSES.

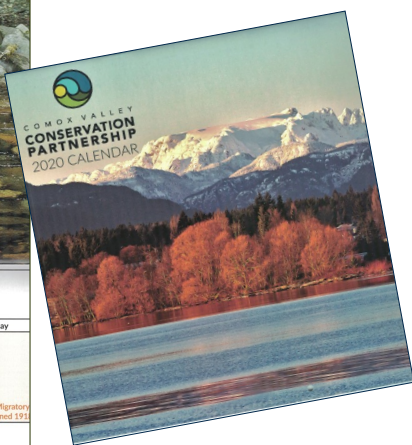

Neighbourhood Emergency Preparedness Program

WE ALL KNOW IT'S COMING BUT WE DON'T FEEL PREPARED

No, I'm not talking about Climate Change I'm talking about the holiday season. But we can help with your preparation! BWS is selling beautiful calendars that make great gifts. Each page has a different photograph showing the natural beauty of our area and our local wildlife. All photos are taken by local photographers. The BWS page, July, has a gorgeous shot of Cowie Creek taken this summer by our own **Lynne Ray** at one of our regular sampling locations. The calendars are \$20 each and BWS gets \$10 of that. Of course, Cowie Creek looks different this time of year than it did in July when Lynne took her calendar photo. A routine sampling trip in



mid November reminds us the seasons have definitely changed. Dead leaves paper the ground in shades of brown and tan and the observant eye can find mushrooms, small and large, in patches along the trail. Mushrooms also turn up in odd places. On a recent visit we found a mushroom cap sitting on a rock along the river's edge, far from the mushroom-nurturing forest floor.

The mushroom looked like it had been nibbled and then left to dry. Our resident forest expert assures us that, indeed, it most likely was left to dry. Squirrels dry mushrooms as part of their preparation for winter.

In Wilfred Creek there is a different winter storage strategy in evidence. Dead, half-eaten fish carcasses litter the banks, a testament to the strategy of bears who prefer to store their winter food as fat. We approach Wilfred with plenty of noise so as not to surprise any of these fattening bears. And we leave as quickly as we can to escape the lovely smell.

While squirrels and bears have their strategies for preparing for winter, humans have more varied needs. We haul out warmer clothes, freeze and can our summer harvest, put our gardens to bed, and begin planning for parties, concerts and family gatherings. We celebrate winter and we celebrate connection. We at BWS have an additional thing to begin planning for: our upcoming Annual General Membership meeting which is scheduled for **January 30th** at the Fanny Bay Hall. (Check our website - www.beaufortwater.org - or our FaceBook for the exact time). This will be our first AGM since becoming a registered society last year. Fortunately, we have members with experience in these sorts of things. And we are thankful to have the expert services of Ingrid Welch (of Antelope Bookkeeping Services) in preparing our year end

financial reports. All BWS members are encouraged to attend. Folks who are interested in joining BWS can become members at the meeting. We will be electing board members and discussing goals, budgets and plans for the next year. If that isn't enticement enough there will be treats. In the meantime, we hope you enjoy making your plans for the holiday season!

PHASE 3 OPEN HOUSE: DECEMBER 4th & 5th CONFIRMED

After ongoing consultation with SPID Trustees and MOTI, our Engineer has been busy developing the design for Phase 3

of the water infrastructure project, covering Ships Point Road (addresses north of 7874), the north loop of Baynes Drive, Vivian Way, Victor Lane and Wente Way. We have scheduled two Open House evenings on **Wednesday, December 4** and **Thursday, December 5, 6-8pm**, at the **SPID Office, 7729 Vivian Way**. Ratepayers are invited to review the drawings and offer feedback. Come out and see what the new project has in store, and let us know your thoughts on the plan.

Volunteer Firefighters... Ships Point Needs You!

Ships Point Volunteer Fire Department is actively recruiting new members, men and women of all ages, to join our department. No previous fire-fighting experience is necessary.

Did you know that volunteers make up more than 80% of B.C.'s firefighters? As a volunteer organization, we recognize that many of our volunteers have work, family commitments, and holidays that are important. Some of our firefighters are retired and some are in the workforce, so we stagger our practices, alternating Tuesday mornings and evenings, so that no matter what your schedule, you can participate.

A federal non-refundable tax credit of \$3,000 plus a provincial tax credit of \$3,000 may be available for those who attend enough practices and training courses. A tax credit is a reminder that the government views our efforts as being of value; but of course this is not the reason that anyone volunteers to become a firefighter. Among the men and women that make up Ships Point Volunteer Fire Department you will find one common thread: the desire to be of service to our community.

To serve the community effectively, we train throughout the year using in-house resources and those of other mutual aid fire departments. Our goal: to be a department that is "Professionally Staffed by Volunteers." Fire Chief Terry Hoffart comes from a military background and offers powerful organizational skills and a clear view of the importance of training, taking some of our members up to Firefighter 2 level. Many of the Firefighters have chosen to train as First Responders, providing a vital service between the 911 call and the arrival of the ambulance. Air brake certification training is provided for those who wish to drive the fire truck.


Ships Point Volunteer Fire Department is comprised of men and women of all ages, some working, some retired, who have energy, commitment and enthusiasm. Being a firefighter is challenging, but rewarding as well. There's a real sense of camaraderie through working together and pushing ourselves to become better, one practice at a time.

FANNY BAY NATURALLY

The number of birds in Canada and the United States has declined by three billion, or 29 percent, over the past 50 years. That's almost a third! This astonishing figure is the conclusion of a study of more than 500 species, which was published in September in the journal *Science* by a team of researchers from universities, government agencies, and nonprofit organizations. The lead author of the study was stunned at the results, and described them as staggering, likening the ecological implications for the human race to the 'canary in the coal mine' scenario. The president of the US-based National Audubon Society called the findings "a full-blown crisis."

The project studied populations of 76 percent of all bird species in Canada and the United States, which represents almost the entire population of birds in the two countries. (The species that were not included only occur in small numbers.) Among the worst-hit groups were warblers - their population dropped by 617 million or 37%. Native sparrows and blackbirds declined by hundreds of millions, while introduced species such as house sparrows and starlings suffered significant losses of 331 million and 83 million respectively. On a positive note, bald eagle, falcon, and waterfowl populations are on the upswing, largely due to conservation efforts.

A map included with the study shows that the grassland habitats of central North America had the highest decline rate at 53%. According to the map, the western forest habitats of Vancouver Island lost approximately 30% of their bird populations and coastal areas about 20%.

There are likely many causes, the most obvious being pesticide use, which kills the insects birds eat, and habitat loss due to development and deforestation. Some researchers and conservationists blame a general 'loss of nature.' Birds are vital to life on the planet - they control pests, pollinate flowers, spread seeds, and regenerate forests. Being food themselves for other species, and eating insects as they do, birds are also an important link in the food chain but, globally, over 40% of insect species are in decline. In fact, our planet is currently experiencing the worst run of animal and plant species die-offs since the loss of the dinosaurs 65 million years ago. According to a UN report, one million species of plants and animals are at risk of extinction, half of them due to "insufficient habitat for long-term survival."

Conservation groups are calling for governments to increase conservation efforts and tighten regulations for pesticide use, but there are also ways for individuals to help by making their yards more bird-friendly. At this time of year, that means putting away your garden tools and just letting nature be.

Let fallen leaves rot in place and enrich the soil, while providing habitat for bugs and foraging for birds. Don't deadhead flowers until spring so that birds can eat the seeds. If you don't have much shrubbery in and around your yard, build a brush pile from branches blown down by storms (or pruned) to temporarily shelter birds and other wildlife from bad weather and predators. Long-term, consider replacing some lawned areas with native trees and shrubs such as dogwoods, hawthorns, sumacs, and other flowering shrubs; many produce small fruits that feed birds during the colder months. Add some evergreens to your yard - cedars and firs provide both food and shelter to birds. Keep your cats indoors when birds are around, although if they are sedentary souls like mine, the glass windows they like to watch the birds through may be more of a threat. Applying decals to windows will help to deter birds from head-on collisions. Find alternatives to chemical fertilizers and pesticides if you use them.

You can also get involved with the monitoring of the bird population in our area. The Christmas Bird Count occurs on a single day every year in over 2000 localities throughout the western hemisphere. Counts are coordinated at the local level, usually by a birding club or naturalist organization. The Deep Bay Christmas bird count covers the area from Big Qualicum River to Buckley Bay, including Fanny Bay, and is on Sunday, December 22. If you have bird feeders in your yard and can identify birds species, record the highest single count of each species, seen that day, in your yard. (*Do not count the same bird visitors more than once, e.g. if you see five juncos at one point and then three juncos later on, only report five juncos*).

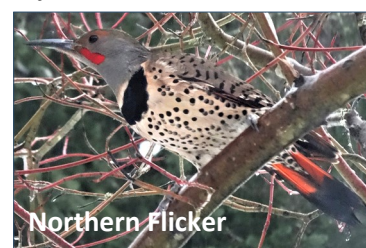
